## CALL FOR ENTRIES

It's time to start thinking about putting quilts in the Bonneville County Fair.

We are lucky! Most county fairs are run by and for the 4-H club or Future Farmers of America. But since guild member Coy Golden introduced quilting as an "open class" competition (that is, open to anyone who submits a quilt), and the County Fair Board supports it every year, we have a show that can be a friendly starting place for new quilters, but also includes some of the finest work to be found anywhere in Eastern Idaho.

This year the fair will be held at a brand-new facility, the new Bonneville County Fair Grounds off Woodruff, just south of Sandy Downs. It's bigger, and we will have lots of space to hang every quilt so it can be seen fully.

If you make a quilt for a friend or a family member, consider not giving it away until after the fair, or at least borrowing it back for the show. We will keep your quilt for just nine days, and give it back to you in plenty of time to put it in the State Fair three weeks later.



- **All** quilts will be displayed Aug. 5-8 in the Education Hall. Quilts will be released for pickup on Friday, August 9th at the new Bonneville County Extension Office, from noon until 5 P.M. Premiums will be available at that time.
- Entries must be finished and complete.
- Art Quilts must be the original design of the quilt maker.
- If you do not want your quilt to be judged, check the 'For display only' box.
- Items to be judged must be the work of the exhibitors. All persons who worked on the quilt must be credited.

1. Fill out an entry form for each quilt entered. Write something interesting about the quilt on the back of this form.
2. Pay your entry fee of \$5 for the first quilt entered and \$1 for each additional quilt.
3. Bring your completed entry form for each quilt entered.

**SECOND UPDATE!!** The lecture has been changed to “From the Beginning: Album of a Quilter”.

The Karen Kay Buckley lecture and classes will be held in June 2019. The lecture has been changed to “From the Beginning: Album of a Quilter” and it will be presented at our guild meeting on Thursday June 20, 2019.

Karen contacted us and asked we change the lecture because she and her husband are driving across the country, visiting another guild along the way, and only have room for one large suitcase of quilts. Since we know you would rather see real quilts instead of power point pictures, we changed the lecture.

The workshops will be held on Friday 6/21/19 and Saturday 6/22/19. One will be hand applique and the other will be machine applique. The cost is **\$75 per workshop for members and \$90 for non-members**. You can mail in a registration or sign up at the guild meeting. #### ***Beyond the Birdhouse***

*I just love seeing beautiful blooming flowers in the spring and summer. At least that is the only time I see them blooming in my area. But, now you can see them year-round with this fun to make 11" x 23" wall quilt. You will be thrilled with your smooth curves, sharp points and perfect circles as you begin to applique on this wonderful little project. And, for some added fun, we will do a little reverse applique.*



### **Machine Applique Workshop – Saturday 6/22/19, 9 AM – 4 PM**

In addition to the \$75 workshop fee there is a pattern plus other item fee of \$35 payable directly to Karen Kay Buckley.

#### ***Wonderfully Whimsical- Machine Applique***

*This is a charming machine appliqued wall quilt measuring 20" x 30" You will learn to make sharp points, smooth curves, perfect circles and nice stems. There is as little reverse applique for some added fun. The technique I teach is a prepared edge method using an invisible stitch. Come join me for a fun day of machine applique. During this class we will focus on the pink vine block on the left and the bug above it.*



The cost is \$75 per workshop for members and \$90 per workshop for non-members. The lecture is free. The guild pays the lecture fee and 1/3 of the travel costs for the national teacher from our guild budget. We try to recover the room rental fee, workshop fees and the remaining travel costs from the money we charge for the workshop. If we can't recover those costs, the guild pays for them also. Every year the teacher fees and travel costs go up but it is still a very good value to have a national teacher come to us and the board believes it is important to offer these opportunities to our guild members.

## Check Your Seam Allowance

### **Piecing recommendations from the January sew-in:**

Check your 1/4" seam allowance before each project. Both fabric and thread choice can require adjustments.

Check by sewing 3 2"x5" pieces together. After pressing, the width should be exactly 5". If not 5", then possible changes are: presser foot (if using the side of the foot for alignment), needle position, type or brand of thread. Once the adjustments are made write down the combination which gave you the correct result.
