Watch directional fabric.

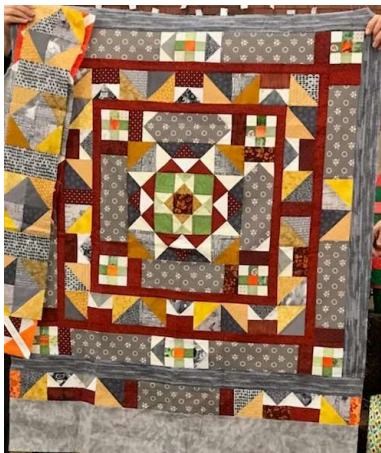
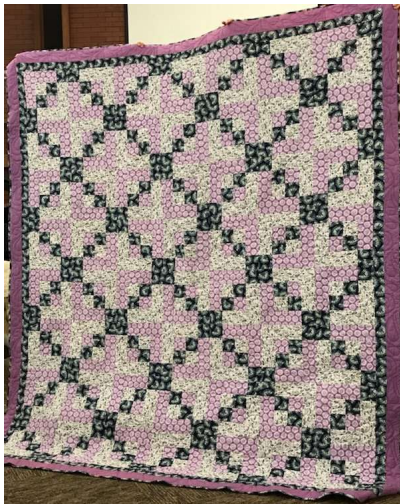
Be sure to save the pattern with the project.
