Intraguild Activities

March Row Quilt Instructions

Row Quilt – Nine Patches 6" Finished Blocks

Designed by Abigail Dolinger

This month you will make Nine Patches for your row quilt. For the queen size quilt, make 6 of Block A and 6 of Block B. Make sure each block measures 6 ½" so that, when joined together, the row measures 72 ½" long. For the twin size quilt, make 4 of Block A and 4 of Block B, alternating them for a 48 ½" long row. For the throw size quilt, make 4 of Block A and alternate them with appliqued heart blocks in Column 3. Column 3 measures 6 ½" x 48 ½."

Note: Instead of following the instructions for single blocks given below, you may strip-piece the Nine Patches if you plan to make several blocks of the same fabric. Cut colored strips and background strips 2 ½" wide.

Block A - Make 6

Cutting – Cut 5 colored 2 %" squares Cut 4 background 2 %" squares

Sewing – use %" seam allowance Arrange the 2 %" squares in three rows of three squares each.

Sew squares together and press toward the colored squares. Sew rows together and press away from the center row. The block measures 6 1/2," unfinished.


Block B - Make 6


Cutting – Cut 4 colored 2 ½" squares Cut 5 background 2 ½" squares

Sewing – use %" seam allowance Arrange the 2 %" squares in three rows of three squares each.

Sew squares together and press toward the colored squares. Sew rows together and press toward the center row. The block measures 6 %," unfinished.

When constructing the row for the queen size quilt or for the twin size quilt, alternate Block A and Block B. The seam allowances will nest nicely. The queen size row measures 6 ½" x 72 ½," and the twin size row measures 6 ½" x 48 ½."

August – Bargello Beauty. Taught by Renee Phillips at Daydreams 10:30 to 3:00. Signups will be available at the Guild Meeting. The pattern is available from 3 Dog Design Company. There are so many variations. This is the definition of piecing. Taking perfectly good fabric, cut it apart, sew it back together, cut it apart again, and sew it back together again.



September – Hemingway Pouch. Back by popular demand. Taught by Christy Christensen at Daydreams. 10:30 to 3:00.
