The Raffle Block for this month is Old Italian Block. Use: Dark to Medium Blue and Yellow. Be careful to not stretch the bias edges. You will get two blocks and a ticket for each.

Make as many blocks as you want.

Intraguild Activities June Row Quilt Instructions

Row Quilt – Framed Four Patches 8" Finished Blocks

Designed by Abigail Dolinger

This row calls for lots of colors and fabrics. Enjoy playing with all the fabrics in your fat quarter pack! For the **queen size** quilt, make 9 Framed Four Patches that measure 8 ½" unfinished. The row measures 8 ½" x 72 ½." For the **twin size** quilt, make 6 Framed Four Patches and sew together for an 8 ½" x 48 ½" row. For the **throw size** quilt, make 3 Framed Four Patches and alternate them with Simple Windmill blocks in Column 4, for an 8 ½" x 48 ½" length.

Cutting - for 1 block

Cut (4) 2 1/2" squares for center Four Patch

Cut (2) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles for frame

Cut (2) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangles for frame

Sewing


Join the 2 ½" squares to make a Four Patch. Press seams to one side.

Sew the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles to opposite sides of the Four Patch.

Press seams toward rectangles.



Sew the 2 ½" x 8 ½" rectangles to the top and bottom of the Four Patch. Press seams toward rectangles.



Hint: Turn every other block 90 degrees so that the $2\,\%$ " x $4\,\%$ " frame rectangles are sewn to the $2\,\%$ " x $8\,\%$ " frame rectangles of the next block.
