Stash For Cash - SRVQG Fundraiser Date: Thursday, April 17, 2025 Location: Calvary Baptist Church, 785 1st St, Idaho Falls Time: Doors open at 6:00 pm, Live Auction begins at 7:00 pm

How does it work?

When the doors open you will be able to purchase tickets for the paper bag auction and pay & take table. Tickets are 50 cents each. You will need to write your name on each ticket or bring address labels to stick on the ticket. Please bring cash or check to purchase tickets.

Paper bag auction: Several tables will be set up in the lobby with bundles of quilting and needlework supplies. Place your tickets in the bag next to all items you are interested in winning. There is no limit to how many tickets you put in a bag. Winning tickets will be drawn during the live auction and attached to the top of the bundle. Pick up bundles you have won after the live auction.

Pay & Take table: These tables will be at the back of the Sanctuary. Books, magazines and patterns are available here for 1 ticket each. A container will be in the middle of the table where you can place your tickets for however many items you have taken (example: 5 books = 5 tickets).

Live Auction: Pick up a list of live auction items at the ticket booth. Items will be laid out on the stage for you to view prior to the auction. Check out a bidding paddle at the Treasurer's table near the stage if you want to bid. All items must be paid for at the end of the auction and taken home that night. Cash, check, and credit cards are acceptable payment.

You are invited to join our summer 2025 silent quilt auction fundraiser. For 6 weeks wonderful outdoor vacation themed auction quilts will be on display in various businesses in Lava Hot Springs, Idaho. The public can submit silent auction bids from May 26 through July 4, 2025.

If you haven't been to Lava Hot Springs lately, you should know the list of outdoor fun is huge. Tubing the river, hiking, zip-lining, soaking in the hot springs, fishing, 4-wheeling, shopping, dining and much more is available. So, the themes for quilts is nearly endless. Get your creative juices going and plan to donate a quilt to the auction. We can donate a printed panel to get you started if you'd like-just let us know.

Here are the details for donated auction quilts:

- Minimum quilt size: 30" long x 30" wide, maximum 86" wide x 86" wide
- · Each quilt must have a 4" finished exhibit sleeve attached on the back
- Each quilt must have a label attached on back of quilt with makers name and phone number
- Entries should be clean, free of animal hair and in excellent condition
- Entry deadline is April 1, 2025. Each entry quilt must be accompanied by submission sheet.
- Visit our website (www.quiltheritagemuseum) on "Current Events" page for entry submission form.
 If you don't have computer access, let us know; we can mail you a submission form.

QHM curators reserve the right to determine exact exhibit quilts. All donated quilts will become property of the Museum. All proceeds go to the Museum.



Quilts with a bold colorful impact are being curated for the Grand Opening quilt exhibit presented by Quilt Heritage Museum, Inc. The Quilt Splash: An Adventure in Color will be open from May 26 through September 11, 2025. The exhibit will be at the Quilt Heritage Museum located at 110 Main Street in Lava Hot Springs, Idaho.

Here are the details for exhibit quilts:

- · Quilts will be exhibited from May 26 through September 11, 2025
- Minimum quilt size: 12" long x 12" wide, maximum 86" wide x 92" wide
- · Each exhibit quilt must have a 4" finished exhibit sleeve permanently attached on the back
- · Each exhibit guilt must have a label attached on back of guilt with makers name and phone number
- · Entries should be clean, free of animal hair and in excellent condition
- Entry deadline is March 15, 2025
- · Each entry quilt must be accompanied by an entry submission sheet





Mastering the ¹/₄" Seam

1. Modern sewing machines have ¼" marks on the machine. Find where your quarter inch is on your machine.



2. Use a sewing gauge to find your quarter inch. The one on the right comes with a magnetic seam guide. You can find this one and similar seam guide rulers for under \$10.



3. Use Basting tape with ¼ inch markings. You can use the tape to mark your sewing table as well. This helps so you don't have to mark your diagonal line when doing blocks like ½ square triangles.




4. Use a quarter-inch foot. They come with and without guides. Each manufacturer's ¼ foot looks a little bit different.



Mastering the ¼" Seam cont.

5. Even with a ¼ inch foot, the feed dogs on your machine tend to pull the fabric to the left. This is when a "ledge" comes in handy. An inexpensive ledge can me made out of building up several pieces of painters tape or there are many options you can purchase. Find one to fit your budget.



6. Not measuring ¼ inch from the right spot. Don't measure your seam, but turn your block over and measure from the front.



7. A scant quarter inch is a couple of threads inside the exact quarter inch. Try this tip to see how your ¼ inch measures up.

a. Take three strips of fabric of the same width (I use 2.5 inch blocks.) and sew them end to end. The middle block should measure 2" inches and the outside blocks should measure 2-1/4". The unit should measure 6-1/2" inches.

b. Press open with a good ironing technique.

c. Measure the distance between the seams. The middle block should measure 2" inches and the outside blocks should measure 2-1/4". The unit should measure 6-1/2" inches.

d. Move your guide/ledge accordingly so you can get the perfect scant 1/4 inch each time.

e. Do it each time you start or switch projects.

f. Remember: The fold takes up space and how much space depends on the type of fabric you're using and the thickness the thread.
